## Policies:

This will include the implementation of appropriate Risk Assessment documents for events at all levels – to ensure any event aligns with the aims of the guild & is complicit with the safeguarding and health & safety requirements.

Guild Finance – planning the spending to meet our charities aims.

- Guild insurance provision thanks to hard work by Fran Watkins (Guild Secretary) we have switched provider & made a significant saving.
- Introduction of a membership management tool this initiative is currently in progress with many of you having already registered your membership already using the online form – thank you! Anyone having difficulties please let your district secretary know.
- We have set up a project team to look at how the Guild to manages church
  closures in relation to the future of the bells and the bell ringing community
  affected. We aim to issue progress reports as we journey through the project.
- As we progress through all the above changes, we will review any Guild rule
  affected by any of the above points and propose amendments as required.

2026 will see the 140<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Guild and we would like to celebrate the occasion with several events and activities. One target we would very much like to achieve in our 140<sup>th</sup> year is to recruit 140 new members; we appreciate such an ambition will require preparation to ensure we have sufficient teaching capacity and a well-orchestrated publicity campaign.

## **Belfries Officer's Report**

This year I have had the chance to inspect a number of rings of bells within the guild. Firstly, in March I inspected the likely broken gudgeon on the tenor bell at Bishops Frome. Quick assessment ascertained that in fact a gudgeon was clearly broken, and professional bell hangers would need to carry out the work to repair the break. I am pleased to report this has been done.

Chris Jones asked for the assistance for an inspection of Coddington bells as part of a greater initiative to inspect all the deemed necessary rings of bells in the Ledbury district. I was impressed with the proactive nature of the officers of the Ledbury district and though Coddington is a very pleasant and easy-going ring of bells, we did find some minor issues that needed addressing. This highlights a greater point of having a regular steeple keeper, as keeping on top of new or older installations do require visiting the belfry often. Whether a clapper slightly comes loose, or a slider runner needs cleaning, keeping on top of these issues reduces the need for more major work.

I have also inspected the belfries of Colwall and Withington and carried out some maintenance while doing the inspections. I also replaced a hasting stay at Stoke Prior with the help of Mark Aston. Other inspections in 2024 have been carried out at Bosbury, Pencombe, Cradley (where an assessment is to be carried out in spring 2025 to try to improve the swing times etc), Chelmarsh where work was carried out to make the bells ringable and Kings Caple (early 2025). Also, assistance was carried out at Lyonshall and Eardisley for fitting the new ropes on the bells.

Kings Caple and Cradley, Hampton Bishop will be my focus for this spring 2025 with work/inspections being carried out shortly.

On Saturday 15th of June at Wellington Church I was invited to conduct a belfry maintenance day organized by the officers of the Hereford district. We spent a morning and an afternoon going through the basics of belfry maintenance as then a demonstration of the David Bagley Oddstruckness meter. This proved to be beneficial to the six students with various degrees of knowledge. This course was followed up with another course in October at Fownhope where another six ringers helped work on improving the bells there. We did sort out some oddstruckness on some of the bells and the locals were happy to report they found the bells easier than before. I am happy to do this course again as it is important we as a guild promote the care of the bells we are so often blessed to ring. Thank you to Jason Walker and Kris Perruzza for conducting the arrangements for these two courses. The Guild has purchased some ear defenders for when such maintenance courses are conducted and will be provided on the day of the course.

I have been approached to give advice of a few towers but no formal invitation to come and without that it is not my remit to come to a tower uninvited. I am here to advise and carry out inspections when ringers and church officials need support.

It is my intention to build a larger base of people who are comfortable to help with practical maintenance of bells. The more steeple keepers the guild train the better the bells will be to ring, and this is a massive positive we the guild should promote to the wider church community as we are custodians of the bells we are entrusted to look after.

Thank you to all those who came and assist me with the job of Belfries Officer over the past year, it valuable to have support when undertaking the inspections and/or repairs.

## **Tower Stewardship Advisor's Report**

In the light (among other things) of revised Church of England 2025 safeguarding training requirements, a review of the Guild's own approach to safeguarding is being undertaken the results of which, following approval by the Trustees and the Diocesan Safeguarding Officer, will be published and communicated to Guild members via District secretaries in due course.

Meanwhile, Guild members should continue to refer to the *Parish Safeguarding Handbook* (available to download from the CofE website) for guidance on all safeguarding issues.

Guild members who lead a ringing event where children or vulnerable adults are present on or off church premises are reminded that they must be DBS checked, must have certificated up-to-date on-line safeguarding training via the CofE and must comply with the Guild's insurance policy conditions.

As authorised church volunteers, bell ringers are required to abide by the Church of England's own safeguarding policies and procedures along with any local variations of individual churches.

Where ringing outside of this environment, say as a Guild member on a tower open day or as an itinerant ringer at churches with no local bands of ringers, CCCBR and ART guidance must have been followed for the Guild's insurance to apply.

Events involving children must include the appropriate involvement of parents/guardians and the Parish Safeguarding Officer if on church premises.

Where Guild events are held at premises which are not churches affiliated to the Guild (see list of towers on the Guild website), special arrangements are likely to be necessary

## **Public Engagement Officer's Report**

In March, the Guild purchased a flag and roller banner to be used at events throughout the Guild to help with publicity and recruitment in bell ringing. They have been used several times across the Guild in the last year, at different events, the first being at the Guild Competition Day at Kington, other events included Cathedrals at Night, Ludlow's Winter Fair, as well as several open tower events that have place alongside art fares, fetes etc. If you are planning a recruitment event, please get in contact if you wish to borrow either. We also had some leaflets printed which have been distributed around churches in the Guild as well as being available at events.

New Guild members are now receiving a welcome pack which includes information about what's happening in the Guild, upcoming events, who's who, as well as an annual report and badge. These have been distributed at District AGMs and meetings and have been well received.

In July we welcomed Hereford City Life to the Cathedral on a practice night who put together a short film about the bells and ringing at the Cathedral, this was shared across social media.

We had several events throughout the year that encouraged engagement from our members, including the Guild Competition Day where all levels of ringing took place, a Guild wide Quarter Peal festival for two weeks in the summer, where 117 Guild members joined in, including those ringing their first quarter. In October we welcomed ringers from around the country to the Guild for our Tower Open Day, which was very enjoyable and a huge thank you to everyone who helped out to make the day possible.

We have several things coming up to get involved with over the next year, as always, if you have ideas, would like to get involved in events, either to participate or help organise, please get in contact. Thank you to all who have helped over the past year and I hope everyone enjoys what we have planned for the next.

## Treasurer's report:

Taking over the role of treasurer and getting access to the bank accounts was made so much easier by the hard work, advice and encouragement I received from Chris Kippin without whom it would have been a mammoth task. His input to the guild and will be sorely missed.

We have had a very successful financial year and despite continually increasing costs and some additional spending we have posted a surplus of £568 taking into account some income we have still to receive, we are having difficulties accessing HMRC system to claim gift aid and allowing for the return of district funds from Bridgnorth district, this is in fact closer to a £750 surplus for the year.

This surplus is due to two main factors, first being the continued growth in subscriptions year on year (but still below the pre pandemic level) and secondly to the absolute sterling work put in by the Guild Secretary into our insurance policies and costs saving us in excess of £1600. This saving alone has funded the new membership system membermojo for 9 years at the current rates.

Costs will continue to rise and 2025 sees a change in the way the CCCBR charge us from a flat rate to a per member rate that will substantially eat into the increase in subscription rates agreed at the AGM in May. The increase to our full number of CCCBR reps will also lead to an increase in officer expenses next year.

The evolution of banking services has now started to impact us with the main stream banks making a monthly charge on the district bank accounts for what was historically a free service, whilst £5 a month doesn't sound much it equates to £480 across the guild. We need to consider how to deal with this going forward and consider the most efficient way collect subscriptions and operate district finances.

Thank you to all of you that have helped me over the past year particularly the district treasurers and for the independent examiner for making sense of my accounts.

Neil Bennett resigned as Peal Recorder with immediate effect on 31st December 2024 due to ill health. As the work of the Peal Recorder is continuous and ongoing, I was approved by the Trustees as (Acting) Peal Recorder from 1st January 2025. I would like to pay tribute to Neil and express thanks for all the meticulous hard work he has put in, not just as peal recorder but by being an executive member of the Guild for 46 years as well. Neil was elected in May 1978 becoming only the fifth peal recorder. The first peal recorder was James P Hyett from Hay (who happens to be my Great Grandfather) until his death in July 1944. In 1945 Leslie Evans from Eardisland took over, followed by Mrs E Chandler in 1953. In 1970 Val Roberts took on the job and started the present day peal book, Val used a stencil kit to write up the peals, a very time-consuming job which meant that recording some peals took longer than ringing them.

Neil has been the peal recorder for 46 years, which makes him the longest serving Guild officer. Neil has recorded all the Guild peals on a database including unpublished peals and peals rung by other societies as well.

I have worked closely with Neil during 2024 as I entered the records of just over 4,000 peals of the Hereford Guild onto the Bellboard website (<a href="https://bb.ringingworld.co.uk/">https://bb.ringingworld.co.uk/</a>). This included all the peals rung for the Hereford DG which had not been published in the Ringing World or the 'Bell News' but which Neil had researched and recorded on the Guild database. The entire peal record of the Guild is now available on Bellboard so that anyone can now search for their own records, individually or by tower. If anyone would like help to find or download their HDG peals on Bellboard please contact me.

You will find within the report details of peals rung in 2023 as well as 2024, as these did not appear in last year's report.

## Trustees' Report 2024

There is an existing offer of £9,000 to **Broseley**, who are actively raising funds for a major restoration of their eight-bell installation and the possible addition of two new trebles. **Much Wenlock** received a grant of £2,500 having applied for help with the scheme to overhaul their bells and frame.

Income exceeded expenditure by £10,022 during the year, and the reserves of the Fund on December 31st stood at just over £84,000.

We thank all those **Parochial Church Councils**, 128 in number, who continue to support us through the affiliation scheme; almost all now pay their annual membership (£4.00 per bell) by standing order.

The *600 Club* made further progress in 2024, with 650 units sold, enabling the Club to make a nett contribution to the Fund of nearly £1,600. Four draws were held and prize money totalling £1,580 was distributed to Club members. We thank the Club's Organiser, Richard Clements, and our District Fund-Raising Representatives for their hard work.

The Trustees are grateful also to our parent **Guild.** We thank it for the £1,400 donated in 2024.

We hope that our District Fund-Raising Representatives will do everything they can to persuade members of the Guild to further increase their support for the BRF, by holding raffles and collections at meetings, treasure hunts, functions, etc., or in any way they can.

The Trustees wish to thank everyone who contributes in any way to the Fund, especially those who make regular **personal donations**. Our Treasurer will readily assist anyone who wishes to donate to the Fund, whether it be a one-off or on a regular basis, perhaps by Standing Order, and whether it is Gift-Aided or not.

#### **Bridgnorth District Report**

Our 2024 District meetings started with our AGM held at Bridgnorth on 3rd February. We rang at St Leonard's and had the service, tea and meeting in the church. We were encouraged by the large number of new members joining the Guild this year. On 6th April we had our District Spring Meeting at Chetton. Chetton only started ringing again in 2023 and our visit was enthusiastically received by the new team. The Chetton ringers put on an impressive buffet for us. Our summer social this year was a ringing outing in Hereford on 10th August. We visited Bodenham, Marden, Hereford All Saints, St Nicholas and then Hereford Cathedral. Attendance was low, with nine attendees from Broseley, Chetton and Coalbrookdale towers, plus one ringer from Clun, making it a tiring but enjoyable day. We especially enjoyed ringing at the Cathedral, where four local ringers made us very welcome and supported us with ringing Rounds on all ten bells,

Grandsire Doubles on the back six and Plain Hunt on 7. Our last District meeting of the year was held on 23rd November at Claverley, which was very much enjoyed by our District ringers.

In 2024 we continued to develop our District teaching capabilities. On 25th January, Darren Swancott from Broseley was assessed by Paul Lewis from ART (Association of Ringing Teachers) for his Module 2C teaching certificate. Two days later on 27th January, Darren attended an ART Module 1 course on teaching bell handling, this time accompanied by Vikki Hirst from Chetton. James Perry from Coalbrookdale later attended a Module 1 course in June. I attended the ART Conference in March, and as usual came away with new ideas and renewed enthusiasm.

We currently have a lot of fairly new ringers in the District and several of our learners have benefitted from learners training sessions run by the Guild in February, July and September. The first session was arranged by our then Master-Elect Sue Robinson, and following the Guild AGM the sessions were continued by the new Master-Elect Kris Perruzza. The training has been very well received and much appreciated by our learners

Ringers from our District also took part in Guild Competition on March 9th. Members of the Coalbrookdale band entered the novice rounds competition and our District team achieved second place in the Call Change competition. It was a very enjoyable day and hopefully more ringers from our District will be encouraged to go along next year. Some of our more experienced ringers ring at towers where we don't have the critical mass for method ringing. We therefore decided to organise a Doubles practice at Bridgnorth on 13th November. This was a welcome opportunity for ringers who spend more time teaching than ringing anything for themselves, and we plan to hold further practices next year.

There were some other events of note in 2024. At the Guild AGM, Valerie Roberts was elected Vice-President in recognition of the outstanding contribution she has made to the Guild. Val became the first lady Master of the Guild in 1968, and was elected Master again in 1993. Val also served as Peal Recorder for 10 years starting in 1970. We were saddened by the death of distinguished ringer Chris Kippin on 18th July. Chris was a member of the band at Cleobury Mortimer and until recently our Guild Treasurer. Chris has provided a huge amount of support to local ringing and the Guild for many years and will be very much missed. On a happier note, Coalbrookdale Tower Captain John Maclean celebrated his 90th birthday on 30th July.

Two of our District Committee will be stepping down at the AGM. Valerie Roberts is stepping down as our Management Committee Representative and Cherry Hughes is standing down as Bell Restoration Fund representative after 25 years in the post! We would like to thank them both for their many years of service to the District and the Guild as a whole.

#### **Hereford District Report**

It has been a busy year, regular practices continue to be well attended with active bands continuing their recruitment and development of new and existing ringers. Marden and Bodenham while feeling the effects of flooding on several occasions throughout the year have pressed on with their recruitment, with their new ringers coming along well while Fownhope has three new ringers after a successful open evening in May.

The district hosted two ART M1 courses at Tarrington and Burghill to build on the skills of our ringers, and to help give confidence to those who wish to help teach bell handling. It is great to see the skills learned have been put into practice already, we hope that this will form a good structure for teaching that we can build on in the future.

With the support of some of our experienced ringers we have delivered sessions in handling; striking; ringing up and down, and Stedman Doubles.

Ashley Fortey (Guild Belfries Officer) has delivered 2 bell maintenance sessions at towers in our district, attended by 9 district members. This was an opportunity to check over/deal with any minor issues at these towers, and train and develop skills in those attending, to take back to their own towers.

Quarter peals have benefitted many of our ringers in developing their skills, with an extra push during the Guild Quarter Peal Festival. Quarters have given people the opportunity to consolidate new methods, improve striking and technique. Notable performances include those who rang their first quarter this year - Noah Powell-Tuck, Jane Davies, David Laws, Sarah King & Vicki Hurlow, well done! Ringing a method and knowing where you are and what you are doing is one thing, but being able to speak and remember where to do it adds all sorts of extra difficulty, so special congratulations go to five of our ringers who took on the challenge of calling their first quarter this year - Nick Chapman, Tyler Edwards, Susannah Peppiatt, Anne Newman & Len Hand. We had two ringers this year who achieved their first peal; Eddie Smith rang the tenor to a peal at Kentchurch on 17th May, this marked the 50th Anniversary of the first peal after the rehanging and augmentation, and was rung in memory of Mr William, Philip and Roland Watkins; and Isabel D'Avanzo rang the treble to a peal of Grandsire Triples at Burghill on 28th December, congratulations to both.

In March members of the district took part in the Guild Competition Day. We entered bands in both the Thomas Cooper & Osbaldiston Shield competitions, we were very pleased to have been placed first for our call-changes! This year there was a new part to the day, the Novice Challenge, it was great to see several bands from the district enter and so many new ringers taking part.

On Saturday 8th June we enjoyed an outing into Wales, ringing at six churches, the first being Mynyddislwyn, where on arrival we found the stay on the treble to be broken so a few of our ringers took on the job of ringing it without the stay. We then went on to Pontypridd and Merthyr Tydfil before lunch. The afternoon began with the fine ring at Ebbw Vale, followed by Blaenavon, we finished our day with the ten bells of Abergavenny.

In October, ten of the district towers opened their doors as the guild played host to an Open Tower Day to raise funds towards the Bell Restoration Fund. It was a great opportunity for our ringers to meet visitors from around the country and ring on some different bells. A big thank you to all involved, especially those who volunteered to steward and organised and provided refreshments.

Remedial work has been carried out at Peterchurch where the bells have been silent for a number of years. Volunteers removed many bags full of bird debris and generally cleaned inside the bell chamber, several stays were repaired, clappers refurbished and

replacement ropes installed. The bells returned to ringing in time for the Christmas Carol Service.

On Sunday 1st December St Nicholas in Hereford held its final services, we had a great turn out for ringing at the morning service and a quarter attempt before the evening Advent Carols, with a festive lunch it was a superb day. We will continue to ring at St Nicholas into the new year.

#### **Ledbury District Report 2024**

Reflecting on the last year, I realised it has been full of our many different and regular activities, all of which work well and which are run and supported by so many. All towers except Stretton Grandison continue with regular practices and Sunday

ringing. There have been a number of new ringers starting during the year, this is something which every tower needs to do

The big initiative for this year was the One-to-Ones, where the tower captains had discussions separately with every member of their band to talk about how they felt they were progressing, their long term goals for the future and their immediate needs for the next few months and year. The sessions also gave an opportunity to discuss what was

going well with tower practices and whether improvements could be made. Some of the information will be used within tower discussions and some is being fed to the district to assist with planning all our training sessions

We have run several Saturday morning training sessions which have been followed up by extended practices and guarter peals. A number of District members attended the Hereford Course and one Saturday morning session was specifically used as a follow up for them all

We have had several mini outings where we rang at a couple of our District towers either side of lunch, occasionally including one of the towers just outside our area. Our 7/8 bell monthly practices are designed to give opportunities to two or three ringers each time to move into 8 bell ringing, at the same time as giving the more experienced ringers something to develop, including inviting more people to try calling touches. We enjoyed the Guild Competition Day, to which we brought the District's Mobile

Training Bell 'The WomBell'. A band from the District also took part in the main competition.

The District Outing was to towers just south of the district Deerhurst, Tirley, Hasfield, Hartbury and Staunton. Thank you Jane and Colin for a great day out.

Congratulations to Judith Faux who won the ART Achievers Award for 2024: she has kindly given her prize as the basis of our new project within the District which is to improve the standard of maintenance of our bells. We have decided to have all towers inspected and to try and encourage work to be carried out by helping to provide some finance to the small projects which would not be covered by other grant bodies. As a community of ringers in the District, we were all deeply saddened by Greg Harris's untimely death in November. He had joined the Bosbury band two years ago and was quickly absorbed into all aspects of ringing. Bosbury's bells were rung by members of the district on 29th November - half-muffled in the morning as his funeral took place in Hereford, and open in the afternoon for the Service of Thanksgiving in Bosbury Church. So it has been a busy and proactive year, thank you everyone for your help and involvement.

#### Ringer Master Ross District Report 2024

#### Insurance

At renewal in October 2024 the management committee considered a range of alternative quotations and providers for our Guild insurances. We opted to take out a new combined liability insurance with Ecclesiastical Insurance, annual premium paid for 2024/25 £229.62

#### Key Information

- Guild liability insurance only covers members taking part in Guild (or district)
  - Most risks associated with bellringing activities are likely to fall on the PCC or owner of the venue where the activity takes place. Ringing for service or practice should be covered by the PCC's liability insurance, any other ringing activities **may** be covered by your own personal liability insurance (such as is included with a household policy, check your own policy for details).
- In the event of a Personal Accident claim the Guild would be the beneficiary rather than the injured person (however it is generally understood that that any monies from a successful claim would be made available to the member or their surviving family).
- These terms have not changed and applied to both the previous and new insurances.
- Our new policy is held with Ecclesiastical Insurance (EIG) and the insurance schedule can be found on the Guild website (hdgb.org). For the purposes of insurance Guild members (volunteers) are classed as employees.

**7. Election of new members:** Wendy Crampton, Allison Devine, Jo Harris, Thomas Pratt, Fred Cook, Paul Hemmings, proposed by Mark Pugh.

Jennie Hodge, proposed by Tim Hollinghurst

Jenny Parker, proposed by Frank Seabright

All seconded by Barney Bell. All present, were in agreement to accepting these new members.

8. Officers Reports had been circulated via email prior to the meeting.

Guild Treasurer Mark Aston proposed adoption of the accounts. This was seconded by Abigail Pugh and the accounts were duly accepted.

The Peal Recorder, Neil Bennett informed all attending members that the peal details had been omitted in the 2023 Report however, it was available upon the Guild Website or could be sent as an electronic file, upon request. Also Neil stated that the Guild had just passed the 6000 peal point and referred to the start of the latest peal volume stating that Val Roberts had entered many of the past peals by hand and only in recent years the luxury of printing via computer, was possible.

# 9. Election of Guild Freeman, this detail had been circulated prior to the meeting. Alan Reade. Claverley. Bridgnorth District

Alan's first appearance in the Guild Report was 1977 having joined the group of ringers at Claverley, a couple of years previously.

In the 1980's, Alan along with Harold Fitter and Martin Harrisson formed a 'Way Forward' subcommittee that led onto the provision of limited insurance cover for ringers and later, to the production of health & safety guidance for the Guild, issued in the 1990's.

Between 2007-2012 the Guild Master (Mark Pugh) requested Alan to review the Guild's position on Safeguarding of Vulnerable Groups Act 2006 which resulted in the production and issue to all towers of formal tower stewardship and safeguarding guidance, for which Alan was presented with the Master's Shield in 2011.

Alan continues to review and up-date this guidance in liaison with the diocesan authorities and provides advice to individual ringers as required.

Again Alan along with Paul Lewis, was involved with the launch of ITTS and the HDGB training schemes, with a burst of fame through an interview prior to the training day's launch, broadcast on BBC Radio Shropshire in 2013.

The Guild Committee has been made aware of Alan's past and continued commitment to such Guild matters and supports his nomination to the position of Guild Freeman.

Alan had given apologies prior to the meeting stating he was disappointed not to be at the AGM in person, due to prior commitments.

The Guild Master requested a confirmation vote to accept Alan Reade as a Freeman to the Hereford Diocesan Guild.

All members present were unanimous in agreeing to accept Alan as a Freeman.

**Election of Guild Vice President:** The Guild Master stated that there had been a proposal for a Vice President. The Master read the following:

Our published Guild reports state that for the year 1956 we had 77 towers affiliate to the Guild and 615 members.

Within the tower of Much Wenlock, 13 ringing members are listed of which, for the first time, is a Miss Valerie M Edge, along with her Father Harry and Harry Anson, Herbert & George Childs, Charles E Edwards, Leo Evans, Ernest Fox, Victor Hollingshead, Leonard Longland, Alan M Jones, Albert Matthews & Harry Perks.

It was not long before Val found her ringing skills for the first peal, scored in May 1959 at Stokesay, trebling for 2 extents of Plain Bob and a lot of Grandsire Doubles in 2h & 45mins with Dad on bell 3 and Leo Evans on bell 2, Des Ferguson 4, William Lloyd on 5 and John Meyrick on Tenor.

In 1968 the Festival was held at Hereford, reportedly with good weather and this is when Miss Valerie Edge took the position of Guild Master for a 2 year period until 1970. Appearing to want to stay very active within the Guild officer's positions, Val then moved to become peal recorder which she passed onto our current peal recorder, Neil Bennett, in 1980.

Val had been an active supporter to many events within the Guild and so must have felt it right to return as Guild Master in 1993 for a further 2 years.

It is recorded within the 1995 report by her successor Rev David Bowen, that anybody in attendance at that year's Hereford Ringing Course, will not forget 'the inimitable way in which Val addressed the opening session by welcoming all in song, creating a precedent difficult to follow'.

This is Val to a 'tee', there to enthuse everyone's spirit to embrace the moment and support each other.

Even now we are enjoying the input at Guild Committee meetings of both her support and guidance in Guild matters.

The Committee had been asked to consider Val for the nomination of Guild Vice-President, given all the work undertaken and continued support along with the passion Val has for our Guild. The Committee unanimously agreed and support this proposal.

The Guild Master requested a confirmation vote to accept Val as a Vice-President to the Hereford Diocesan Guild.

All members present were unanimous in agreeing to accept Val to the position; Vice-President.

10. Election of Executive Officers: the following were elected as Executive Officers:

The Guild Master confirmed he was to retire at the end of the meeting and that the following people were prepared to stand:

Guild Master – Sue Robinson, Guild Treasurer – Mark Aston, Peal Recorder – Neil Bennett, Guild Education – Jessica Pugh & Report Secretary – Neil Bragg

Nick Cooper-Tompkins proposed as the officers were all prepared to stand, that they should be reelected 'en bloc', this was seconded by Martin Harrisson, with all in favour.

Secretary –following 2 nominations, Fran Watkins & Tim Joiner a vote was undertaken with counts by Nick Chapman & Nick Cooper-Tomkins. The return count stated that Fran Watkins was elected as Guild Secretary.

#### 11. Election of Non-Executive Officers:

The Management Committee had received nomination from Hereford District for Kris Perruzza as Master Flect

The Master requested a vote for/against. All in attendance were in favour and Kris was duly elected.

The existing non-executive officers all were willing to stand again. Neil Bragg proposed that they should be re-elected 'en bloc'; this was seconded by Sue Robinson, with all in favour.

- **12. Election of Clerical Representatives:** Barney Bell, Nicky Seabright and Anthony Ellis were all willing to stand again and were proposed by Frank Seabright, seconded by Jane Mason, with all in favour.
- **13. Election of Central Council Representative:** The Management Committee had received confirmation that the existing Central Council representatives (Anthony Ellis and Abigail Pugh) were prepared to stand again and given there were no further nominations, Nick Cooper-Tomkins proposed that they should be re-elected 'en bloc', this was seconded by Pauline Leggate, with all in favour.

Nick Cooper-Tomkins and the Guild Master thanked the CC Reps for an excellent report from the last Council AGM in September 2023.

- **14. Independent Examiner:** The Guild Treasurer gave a reason for the change in Independent Examiner and proposed Ruth d'Avanzo, this was seconded by Barbara Fox with all in favour.
- **15. Guild Subscription:** The Guild Treasurer had explained the situation with forecasting and potential expenditure, stating cost rises due to inflation and general economics, proposing that the subs were increased by £2 making an annual subscription of £10 for standard ringing membership with no alteration to any other membership subscription levels, as outlined in the Guild Report. This proposal was seconded Frank Seeabright, with all in favour

Barbara Fox asked if the subscription could be paid via bank transfer, Mark responded to state that he actively encouraged that all Districts take this route to accept future subscriptions.

**16.** Addition to the rules: The Guild Master explained that the Management Committee had been requested to consider 'an events co-ordinator' that would represent a group of members who undertook events, such as the Guild striking competition. Following debate, at the committee meeting, a final agreement to add this role to the Non-Executive officers was proposed by Ashley Fortey, seconded by Anthony Ellis.

Jenny Lawrence requested clarification on what this person would undertake within the role. Nicky Aubrey gave a concise response stating that there is a need to change the Thomas Cooper Striking Competition to an event and have a representative that then attends the management meetings. It was clarified by Jane Mason that this was not a rule change and no more than an addition, which was in line with current rules. Discussion took place over the concern of any member of the 'events team', attending. Following further discussion on the topic, Nicky Aubrey proposed Richard Bracher to the new position, seconded by Fran Watkins, with all in favour.

- **17. Agree donation to BRF:** Mark Aston stated, following previous reduction to the grant, he suggested an increased, back to the level that the Guild was donating before the pandemic, he proposed a grant of £1400. This proposal was seconded by Frank Seabright, with all in favour. On behalf of the BRF, Jane Mason thanked the Guild for its continued support.
- **18. Awarding of the Centenary Shield:** The Guild Master, started off by stating the shield was usually presented to an individual. However, this time he had been so impressed by the efforts and turn out at the Guild Striking Competition, the Master wished to award the Centenary Shield to the team for all their hard work and enthusiasm, Nicky Aubrey accepted the shield on behalf of the group.
- **19. Awarding of the George Cousins Cup:** On behalf of the BRF, Neil Bennett explained that no AGM had been held by the BRF and as such, no nominations had been received for consideration, allowing the George Cousins cup to be awarded.

There is a meeting planned soon and the BRF would be in touch if there is to be a presentation in the near future

**20. Invitation for the 2025 AGM:** Recently retired Ross on Wye District Secretary, Pauline Leggate, invited the Guild to the Ross on Wye District for the 2025 AGM.

#### 21. Any Other Business:

Frank Seabright proposed a vote of thanks to Chris Kippin, though retired from the position of Guild Treasurer, he has very kindly continued many of the functions that the role requires over the last 12 months supporting the Guild. This was seconded by Mark Aston followed with a round of applause. David Parker proposed a vote of thanks to the Clifford & Kington District for making all the AGM arrangements and hosting an excellent ringer's tea. David also went on to thank the Rev Rosie Roberts for leading the service with special thanks for arranging sunny weather too.

Barney Bell proposed a vote of thanks to Tim Hollinghurst for playing the organ and stating that many were due to retire, thanked Nick Cronin for the time he had given to the Guild as Master. Barney also went on to thank Mark Pugh for all information he sent out over his 5 year period as Secretary with encouragement emails and minutes of meetings stating that he has done an amazing job during his time in the position, not just the 2 management meetings and Guild AGM but all the other items undertaken throughout the year. Closing prayers and blessing, led by Rev. Nicky Seabright

## Rules of the Guild (as revised May 11th, 2024)

Registered Charity No 1105766

- **1 Name.** The Guild shall be called The Hereford Diocesan Guild of Bellringers, hereinafter referred to as the Guild.
- 2 President. The Bishop of Hereford shall be invited to be the President of the Guild.
- 3 Vice-Presidents. The Suffragan and/or Assistant Bishop shall be invited to be joint Vice-Presidents of the Guild. Any other persons considered to have given outstanding and exceptional service to the Guild may be elected to be Vice-Presidents at an Annual General Meeting of the Guild after recommendation by the Management Committee.
- **4 Objects.** The objects of the Guild are:
- (a) to advance the Christian religion by the ringing of bells for worship and other appropriate occasions with the attractiveness of perfection.
- (b) to promote and encourage the art of bellringing for the public benefit, in particular but not exclusively, by the provision of education and training in change ringing.
- (c) to promote due order in the belfry, and to bring ringers into closer fellowship with each other.
- (d) to promote an interest in the care of all bells in the Diocese.
- **5 Membership and Election of Members.** Members shall be categorised as:
- (a) Ringing Members. Any ringer having been elected at a District or General Meeting shall be a Ringing Member of the Guild. Subscriptions shall be determined by a General Meeting of the Guild, after considering any recommendations from the Management Committee. A reduced rate shall be payable by persons under the age of 18.
- Any ringer who has completed 25 years as a Ringing Member of the Guild shall be presented with a silver-coloured badge at an Annual General Meeting and this will be recorded in the Annual Report.
- (b) **Life Members.** Any ringer who has completed 50 years as a Ringing Member shall be proposed as a Life Member of the Guild at an Annual General Meeting and upon election no further subscription shall be payable. A gold-coloured badge will be presented and this will be recorded in the Annual Report.
- (c) **Associate Members.** Any persons (other than active ringers) wishing to support the work of the Guild shall be entitled to become Associate Members. They shall be elected at District Meetings, and subscriptions shall be determined as above [Rule 5(a)]. An Associate Member has no power to vote at a Guild Meeting.
- (d) Freemen. After recommendation by the Management Committee, the honour of Freeman may be conferred by the Annual General Meeting on members considered worthy of special recognition by reason of services rendered to the Guild. The number of Freemen shall not exceed twelve.
- (e) Non-Resident Life Members.
- (i) A ringer normally resident outside the Diocese of Hereford may be elected a Non-Resident Life Member at a District or Guild Meeting and a subscription determined as above [Rule 5(a)] is payable to the District Treasurer or Treasurer at the time of election.
- (ii) A Non-Resident Life Member may be elected provisionally immediately prior to a Guild peal attempt. The new member shall be proposed and seconded by members of the Guild, of whom at least three shall take part in the peal attempt. The new member's name, address and subscription, together with the peal details [as per

Rule 17(c) and (d)], shall be forwarded to the Peal Recorder, who will arrange for the provisional tower election to be ratified at a District or Guild meeting and will forward the subscription to the Treasurer.

- (iii) A Non-Resident Life Member has no power to vote at Guild meetings.
- (iv) A Ringing Member who leaves the Diocese shall be entitled to become a Non-Resident Life Member without further payment following notification to the appropriate District Secretary.
- (v) A Non-Resident Life Member becoming resident in the Diocese shall cease to be a Non-Resident Life Member but may become a Ringing Member subject to ratification at the next available meeting and payment of the annual subscription.
- **6 Voting.** All elections and decisions at Guild meetings, other than those involving an alteration to the Rules, shall be decided by a simple majority of the members voting (including the Chairman of the meeting) and in the event of a tied vote the Chairman of the meeting shall have the casting vote.

#### 7 Officers.

- (a) Executive Officers. The Guild shall appoint Executive Officers who shall be ex officio Trustees of the Guild. They shall collectively exercise day-to-day administration of the Guild and shall hold all residual executive powers. They may hold such informal meetings as are deemed necessary, both to deal with urgent routine matters and to formulate proposals for consideration by the Management Committee and the Districts.
- (b) The Executive Officers of the Guild are:
- (i) the Guild Master:
- (ii) the Guild Secretary:
- (iii) the Guild Treasurer:
- (iv) the Peal Recorder;
- (v) the Report Secretary:
- (vi) the Guild Education Officer.
- (c) Non-Executive Officers. The Guild may appoint such Non-Executive Officers as it sees fit:
- (i) the Master Elect;
- (ii) the Public Engagement Officer;
- (iii) the Guild Belfries Officer;
- (iv) the Tower Stewardship Advisor.
- (v) the Webmaster
- (vi) the 'events co-ordinator'.
- (d) Nominations for Guild Offices. Nominations for Executive Officers, Non-Executive Officers and Central Council Representatives shall, in years when the offices are open for election, be forwarded to the Secretary by 28th February, such nominees having indicated their willingness to serve.
- (e) **Election of Officers.** Officers shall be elected from the membership of the Guild at an Annual General Meeting, after considering any recommendations that might be made by the Management Committee, and shall take office from the end of the meeting at which they are appointed.
- (f) Term of Office.
- (i) The Master shall be elected for a term of three years and thereafter may be reelected on an annual basis, subject to a maximum term of six years.
- (ii) All other Officers shall be elected for a term of one year and may, if they wish, offer themselves for re-election.

- (iii) In the event of a casual vacancy the Management Committee shall have the power to co-opt from the membership of the Guild. Any Officer thus co-opted shall serve until the next Annual General Meeting when the vacancy shall be filled by election.
- (iv) No Executive Officer shall (otherwise than as a Trustee of the Guild) acquire any interest in property belonging to the Guild or receive remuneration or be interested in any contract entered into by the Trustees.
- 8 Duties of Officers.
- (a) The **Guild Master:** shall, if he or she desires, preside at any meeting and take charge of ringing at any Guild or District Meeting at which he or she is present.
- (b) The Guild Secretary: shall keep the minutes of the General and Committee meetings of the Guild, issue notices of General meetings, maintain contact with the Guild membership through the District Secretaries and carry out such other duties as may be required by the Management Committee. The Secretary shall inform the President and Vice-Presidents of all Guild meetings and activities.
- (c) The Guild Treasurer: shall pay into the Guild banking account all monies received by him or her on behalf of the Guild. He or she shall keep such accounts as the Management Committee desire and publish accounts as directed by the Management Committee. At the Annual General Meeting he or she shall present an independently examined statement of account made up to the previous 31st December. He or she shall, on instructions from the Management Committee, invest Guild funds which are surplus to current needs.
- (d) The Peal Recorder: shall record all peals rung for the Guild and maintain a Guild peal book. The Peal Recorder shall be responsible for ensuring, so far as practicable, that all peals have complied with Rule 17.
- (e) The **Report Secretary:** shall compile and present an Annual Report of the Guild as early as possible in accordance with the Management Committee's wishes.
- (f) The **Guild Education Officer:** shall co-ordinate the work of the District Education Officers and convene their meetings from time to time.
- (g) The Public Engagement Officer: shall promote the work of the Guild.
- (h) The Guild Belfries Officer: shall organise training courses in belfry maintenance and, when requested, give informal advice on routine maintenance of bell installations in Guild towers.
- (i) The Tower Stewardship Advisor: shall issue guidance to the Guild on tower management, with particular reference to insurance, complaints about noise, protection of children and vulnerable adults, health and safety, fire risk assessment and Church and common Law.
- 9 Management Committee.
- (a) Membership. The Management Committee shall consist of:
- (i) the Officers of the Guild [as stated in Rule 7];
- (ii) the Secretary of, and one elected representative from, each District;
- (iii) the Central Council Representatives;
- (iv) four Clerical Representatives from the Diocese, who shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting after considering any recommendations from the Management Committee;
- (b) Meetings. There shall be at least two ordinary Meetings of the Management Committee in every year. One of these meetings shall be held not earlier than 7th March in each year prior to the Annual General Meeting. The Secretary may call other meetings after consultation with the Executive Officers, or at the request of a Management Committee meeting.

(c) Quorum. Twelve members of the Management Committee shall form a quorum.

#### 10 Annual General Meeting.

- (a) The Annual General Meeting of the Guild shall ordinarily be held on the second Saturday in May in a Guild District to be determined by the previous Annual General Meeting or, in the event of any difficulties, by the Management Committee.
- (b) The Agenda for the Annual General Meeting shall be decided by the Management Committee and shall be distributed to District Secretaries not less than three weeks prior to the date of the Meeting; it shall
- (i) include any item proposed by a District or the Management Committee;
- (ii) give full details of any proposed alteration to these rules, such proposal to be in accordance with the requirements of Rule 20 hereof;
- (iii) consider the donation to the Hereford Diocesan Guild of Bellringers Bell Restoration Fund of an amount not exceeding the sum specified by the Management Committee;
- (iv) include, at the discretion of the Management Committee, any item proposed by an individual Member:
- (c) The Meeting shall, after considering any recommendations from the Management Committee, elect an Independent Examiner who shall examine the accounts of the Guild and submit a report to the next Annual General Meeting. This report shall be attached to the published accounts.

### 11 Special General Meeting.

- (a) The Secretary shall call a Special General Meeting;
- (i) on the instructions of the Management Committee;
- (ii) within six weeks of receiving a motion signed by twenty-five Members of the Guild (Ringing Members, Life Members or Freemen) specifying the motion to be placed before the Meeting.
- (b) The Secretary shall give four weeks' notice to District Secretaries of the calling of a Special General Meeting;
- (c) The quorum for a Special General Meeting shall be fifty Members.

#### 12 Property.

- (a) All property of the Guild shall be the responsibility of the Management Committee.
- (b) The Secretary shall have powers of discretion on conditions of issue and shall submit an annual report to the Management Committee on the state of the property and the loans made.
- (c) Written applications for loans shall be made to the Secretary.

#### 13 Finance.

- (a) The financial year of the Guild shall be from 1st January to 31st December.
- (b) The accounts of the Guild shall be submitted by the Guild Treasurer to the Independent Examiner and shall be published in the Annual Report.
- (c) Guild membership subscriptions shall be collected by the Districts.
- (d) Subscriptions become due for payment on 1st January and shall be forwarded by the District Treasurers to the Guild Treasurer in accordance with Rule 14(g).
- (e) On receipt of subscriptions from the Districts the Guild Treasurer shall disburse to each District a sum of money towards its running costs. The amount allocated to each District shall be determined by the Trustees after considering the financial situation of the Guild and each District's accounts and budgeted expenditure for the coming year.

#### 14 Districts.

(a) The Guild shall be divided into Districts, the boundaries of which shall be decided by the Management Committee.

- (b) Each District will be expected to conduct its own affairs, and shall take appropriate measures to maintain proper control of its finances, but shall have regard to the Guild Rules and Management Committee decisions.
- (c) The financial year of the Districts shall be from 1st January to 31st December or such other date as shall be approved by the Management Committee.
- (d) Each District shall elect a Secretary, Treasurer, one representative to the Management Committee and such other Officers as they consider necessary.
- (e) Each District shall hold an Annual General Meeting before 28th February, at which the District Officers shall present a District Report and a Statement of Accounts.
- (f) The District Secretary shall be responsible for sending to the Report Secretary not later than 28th February a copy of the District Report, together with a list of paidup members for the previous year and addresses (including e-mail addresses, if possible) of District Officers and Tower Correspondents for the current year.
- (g) The District Treasurer shall be responsible for sending to the Guild Treasurer not later than 28th February a Statement of the District's accounts for the previous year, duly approved by a District meeting, a budgeted expenditure plan for the current year, together with a list of current paid-up members and the subscription money collected from them.
- (h) Notice of any District meeting shall be given to the Tower Captain or Secretary of each tower within the District.

#### 15 Central Council of Church Bell Ringers.

- (a) The Guild shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers and shall loyally abide by the Rules and Decision thereof.
- (b) Central Council Representatives shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting every year. Nominations should be received by the General Secretary by 28th February.
- (c) Each Representative attending the Annual General Meeting of the Central Council shall be entitled to such sums as agreed by the Management Committee towards out-of-pocket expenses.

### 16 Suspension and Lapse of Membership.

- (a) The Management Committee shall have power to dismiss any members who fail to comply with the Rules of the Guild, or who render themselves unfit for membership. The Committee shall report their name to the next General Meeting and in the event of the member being dismissed all payments made to the Guild shall be forfeited. No member shall be dismissed, however, until they have been given seven days notice in writing by the Secretary of the time and date at which they shall be required to attend before the Management Committee.
- (b) Members who have not paid their subscription by the 31st December of the current year shall automatically, and without notice, cease to be members with effect from the previous 1st January; they may be re-admitted without election at any time on payment of one year's arrears together with the then current annual subscription.
- (c) Members who have not paid their subscription for the current year by 28th February shall be deemed to be in arrears; their membership and insurance cover shall be suspended until their subscription is received by the Guild Treasurer.

#### 17 Peals.

- (a) All peals that are rung for the Guild shall conform in all respects to the Rules and Decisions of the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers.
- (b) All ringers taking part in such peals shall be fully paid-up members of the Guild, elected in accordance with Rule 5 hereof.

- (c) A fee, to be determined by a General Meeting after considering any recommendation from the Management Committee, shall be paid to the Guild for recording the details of any peal as a Guild performance.
- (d) The conductor of the peal shall be responsible for sending details of the performance, together with the fee [as in Rule 17(c) hereof] to the Peal Recorder within one month of the peal being rung.
- 18 Annual Report. At the discretion of the Management Committee the Guild shall publish a Report, the form, contents and price of which shall be determined by the said Committee.
- **19 Rules.** A copy of the Rules shall be issued to every Ringing Member.
- 20 Alteration of Rules.
- (a) No alteration, deletion or addition to these Rules shall be made except at an Annual or Special General Meeting.
- (b) Any such proposal for consideration at an Annual General Meeting shall be made either by a District or by the Management Committee and shall be received by the Guild Secretary not later than 30th September in the preceding year.
- (c) Any proposal to alter, delete or add to these rules at a Special General Meeting shall be made in accordance with Rule 11 hereof.
- (d) Any alteration to these rules must receive the assent of not less than two thirds of the Members present.
- (e) No amendment shall be made to these rules that will cause the Guild to cease to be a charity in law.
- (f) Following any decision to amend these rules a copy of the revised rules, together with a copy of the minutes of the meeting at which they were adopted, shall be sent to the Charity Commission for England and Wales.
- 21 Dissolution. If the Trustees decide that it is necessary or advisable to dissolve the Guild it shall convene a meeting of all members of the Guild, of which not less than 21 days' notice (stating the terms of the resolution to be proposed) shall be given. If the proposal is confirmed by a two-thirds majority of those present and voting the Trustees shall have the power to realise any assets held by or on behalf of the Guild. Any assets remaining after the satisfaction of any proper debts and liabilities shall be given or transferred to such other charitable institution or institutions having objects similar to the objects of the Guild as the members of the Guild may determine or failing that shall be applied for some other charitable purpose. A copy of the statement of accounts, or account and statement, for the final accounting period of the Guild must be sent to the Charity Commission for England and Wales.
- **22 Interpretation.** The interpretation of the above rules, and any matter not covered by them, shall be decided by the Management Committee.
